

“International Master in Regulatory Sciences (IMRS)” (2014-2019).

Implementation Agreement.

Art. 1 - Within the framework of the agreement “CMU-OMU Label” of collaboration between the Ondokuz Mayıs University (OMU) and the Community of Mediterranean Universities (CMU) / Unesco Unitwin Chair, NGO recognised by Unesco and Associate with UNAI, it is decided to implement the “International Master in Regulatory Sciences” (IMRS) with the collaboration of the Ondokuz Mayıs University, the Community of Mediterranean Universities and the Gianni Benzi Pharmacological Research Foundation (FGB).

Art. 2 - The OMU, the CMU and the FGB are the Leading Institutions of the proposed Master.

Art. 3 - A “Joint Committee” will organise the list of the teaching modules specifying the different activities to be performed, such as front lectures, laboratories, stages, self-learning etc.; subsequently it will be replaced by the “Faculty” established by the Teachers participating in the Master.

The Faculty will be involved in:

- issuing in the meantime an international call for students coming from OMU and the CMU's adhering universities, advertised also by international media;
- recruiting the teaching staff from OMU's, CMU's adhering universities and FGB's international partnership;
- assigning to recruited teachers the didactic activities;
- fixing the number of students to be admitted and the procedures to be set up.

Art. 4 - The CMU agrees to carry out the activities assigned on the basis of Art. 3 of the Agreement “CMU-OMU Label” Study Programme.

Art. 5 - The OMU agrees to carry out the activities assigned on the basis of Art. 4 of the Agreement “CMU-OMU Label” Study Programme.

Art. 6 - The FGB agrees to carry out the activities assigned on the basis of Artt. 3 and 4 of the Agreement “CMU-OMU Label” Study Programme, and will sign it for acceptance. FGB undertakes the responsibility to organise the didactic activities that will be delivered online (e-learning) and will be in charge of the scientific coordination and the dissemination activities of the whole Master programme.

Art. 7 – The Master Programme is scheduled in 1.500 hours, of which 300 hours should concern the front lecturing. The latter will be divided into 120 hours of face to face lecturing (F2F), delivered in 3 didactic weeks and 180 hours of e-learning lessons that will be delivered in 3 months. They also include 40 hours of laboratories during the F2F sessions and 60 hours of webinars, meeting professors through live streaming sessions during the e-learning lessons. The Joint Committee and/or the Faculty will define the self- and online-learning activities, stage period and the procedures for the preparation of the final thesis.

The planned 120 hours of F2F lectures (8 hours/day, 5 days a week) will be carried out by approximately 9 teachers.

For the F2F lectures an average of 12-14 hrs/teacher has been worked out, therefore the stay of each teacher is planned for two days.

Teachers will be accommodated by CMU.

Art.8 – The total amount of the fees collected by both CMU and OMU will cover all the expenses and the surplus/deficit will be equally assigned to the Leading Institutions.

Art. 9 – Fees, board and accommodation should be paid by the students. Stationery, the use of classrooms, labs, e-learning costs and anything needed for implementing the didactic activities will be covered, free of charge, by the fees of the students.

Art. 10 - The travel, board and accommodation expenses for the teachers should be covered by the tuitions of the students; alternatively the Associate Institutions will cover the travel expenses of their own teachers (see art. 12 & 13 of the present agreement).

Art. 11 - Any additional cost will be covered by the Leading Institutions unless some funds become available from public bodies, private organizations and/or donors. Any revenue will be equally assigned to the Leading Institutions.

Art. 12- Any other University which should ask to participate in implementing the present master and is willing to sign its diploma will be allowed to participate as “Associate Institution” provided that the Joint Committee or the Faculty will agree.

Art. 13 - The Associate Institution may propose teachers in the Faculty. The Associate Institutions are supposed to contribute to cover the expenses of their teachers. Furthermore the Associate Institution could accept to perform some on-line teaching activities.

Art. 14 - The meetings of the Faculty can occur also through on-line conferences.

Art. 15 - The obligations for each Leading as well as Associate Institution are described at the Artt. 3 and 4 of the Agreement “CMU-OMU Label” Study Programme.

Art. 16 - The OMU, the CMU and the FGB look after advertising the “International Master in Regulatory Sciences” (IMRS).


