I. Motivation

All the countries in the Mediterranean region are facing serious political, societal and economic challenges. Employability of young people, especially young graduates is one of the most crucial problems. Close co-operation involving countries, the business community and the higher education institutions becomes more essential to overcome a major threat which is youth unemployment.

Improving youth graduates' employability can be achieved only by close cooperation between private sector, which will increase their competitiveness by investing in human capital from one side in the Mediterranean zone. From another, the employment institutions and universities – together – will increase the youth knowledge, which can meet the corporate expectations and needs, thus facilitating youth recruitment.

Labelled by the Union for the Mediterranean, the HOMERe program sets ambitious objectives to restore hope to the Mediterranean youth.

II. Objective

HOMERe regional consortium is structured to promote the youth international mobility in business for future talented graduates – ensuring processes of quality screening and selection, from the higher education in the Mediterranean basin. Request is originally initiated by private sector – for a company based in the Mediterranean region – where there is a HOMERe group in each of the participating countries.

This consortium is renewed June 2019, on the occasion of launching of the second phase of the program as labelled by UfM.

III. Responsibilities

HOMERe Signed Chart aspires to develop continuous cooperation and commitment to work for the programme's development and involvement that can be defined in a specific implementation for each member, where there is a designated contact person.

The Regional Consortium Members will collaborate to continuously:

- Promote HOMERe programme, along their events, meetings and communications actions;
- Search for enterprises and / or associations that could be interested in providing international internship opportunities;
- Executing all initiatives that could benefit the programme, noticing that any other (new) initiative will be developed in a separate document;
- Escorting and guiding intern along his / her international internship;
- Participating in activities and actions related to HOMERe either implemented in their countries or relevant to the HOMERe scope of work.
